Dear SWESSE Members

This is a short update on SWESSE related activities and events that are of interest to all our members.

REPORT FROM ESSE BOARD MEETING, BRAGA, 2015

The ESSE (European Society for the Study of English) Board Meeting was held at Braga, Portugal, 27-28 Aug, 2015. The meeting was attended by the national representatives from 19 countries: Austria, Belgium, Croatia, Czech Republic, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Spain, Switzerland, Turkey, and United Kingdom. Also in attendance were the ESSE President, Prof Liliane Louvel, Université de Poitiers; Treasurer, Prof Alberto Lazaro, Universidad de Alcalá; Secretary, Prof Smiljana Komar, University of Ljubljana; and guest member, Webmaster, Dr Jacques Ramel, Université Lyon 2. Sadly, due to the death of my mother just that week, I was unable to attend, and at such short notice was unable to organise a replacement.

Among the many items on the agenda were the reports from the organisers of the conference ESSE-12, Košice 2014, as well as the organisers of the forthcoming conference ESSE-13, to be held in Galway, 22-26 Aug, 2016 – see further info below.

The Board unanimously elected Professor Liliane Louvel as President of ESSE for another term of three years.

The Board also unanimously elected Dr Adrian Radu as new Editor of *The Messenger*, and warmly thanked Prof Hortensia Pârlog, Universitatea de Vest, Timișoara, Romania, for her many years of service as editor. Adrian Radu's three-year term begins 1 Jan, 2016.

The Board accepted the proposal that in 2017 the ESSE Board meeting and PhD sessions would take place in Thessaloniki, Greece.

The Board also accepted the bid for the ESSE-14 conference in 2018, to be held at Brno, in the Czech Republic. The conference will be organized by CZASE and the Department of English and American Studies of Masaryk University. The proposed dates are from 27 Aug–2 Sept, 2018.

ESSE BOOK AWARDS, 2016

The next ESSE Book Awards will be presented at the forthcoming ESSE Conference, Galway University, Mon 22 – Fri 26 Aug, 2016.

The Board agreed that the prize money for each of the three classes (English Language and Linguistics; Literatures in the English Language; and Cultural Studies) is €1,500 for category A, and €1,500 for category B.

Deadline for submissions is: **1 Feb, 2016.**

At the recent ESSE Board Meeting, the following proposals regarding *The Messenger* were unanimously accepted:

1. *The Messenger* will be divided into an academic journal and blog.
2. *The Messenger* and blog will be published within the existing website, using WordPress.

3. The Editor will be responsible for both *The Messenger* and the blog.
4. *The Messenger* will be open to academic and professional articles and to young researchers.
5. *The Messenger* will be open-access with the first year code-protected access.
6. The academic papers will be submitted to two double-blind peer-reviews.

NATIONAL FORUM FOR ENGLISH STUDIES

Luleå University of Technology, 20 –22 May, 2015

The National Forum for English Studies was held at Luleå University of Technology (LTU), 20–22 May, 2015, hosted by Prof Lydia Kokkola, Prof of English and Education, at the Department of Arts, Communication and Education, Luleå. The theme of the conference was “English and Education,” with focus on connections between current research in English and how English is taught at universities and schools throughout Sweden. Plenary sessions, poster sessions and working groups discussed and reflected over current research projects and how these inform our work with undergraduates and society at large, and delegates presented their on-going projects in the form of short papers. The keynote speakers included Roxanne Harde (University of Alberta), Jeannette Littlemore (University of Birmingham), Eva Björck (The Swedish Research Council) and Norbert Schmitt (University of Nottingham).

We were delighted to see many SWESSE members in attendance, and on behalf of the SWESSE Board, I wish to thank Lydia Kokkola and the organising committee for their hospitality and a very enjoyable conference.

SWESSE RELATED FORTHCOMING CONFERENCES

NAES Conference, University of Agder, Norway, 4-7 May, 2016

The 12th triennial conference for the Nordic Association of English Studies (NAES) will take place at the University of Agder, Norway, 4-7 May, 2016. The conference is open to academics working in such fields as English linguistics, literatures in English, cultural studies, and English-language pedagogy. Interdisciplinary approaches are welcome. The theme of the conference is *Englishes and Changing Identities in the North*, and the focus this year will be on discussions and re-evaluations of English identities, particularly in the Northern hemisphere, as realized through language, literature and culture.

Deadline for abstracts is **11 Dec, 2015**. Paper proposals should be no more than **250 words** and panel proposals no more than **500 words**. The submissions should be sent to the following email address: Charles.Armstrong@uia.no.
