Welcome to your Autumn/Winter update on SWESSE related activities and events of interest to our members.

**1. REPORT FROM ESSE BOARD MEETING, GALWAY, 2016**

As representative for SWESSE, I was privileged to attend the ESSE (European Society for the Study of English) Conference, at Galway University, Mon 22 Aug – Fri 26 Aug 2016. Before the conference, I attended the ESSE Board meeting, which took place from Sat 20 Aug – Mon 22 Aug. The meeting was attended by the national representatives from 21 countries: Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Denmark, Finland, France, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Serbia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, and UK. Also in attendance were the ESSE President, Prof Liliane Louvel, Université de Poitiers; Treasurer, Prof Alberto Lazaro, Universidad de Alcalá; Secretary, Prof Smiljana Komar, University of Ljubljana, and guest member, Webmaster, Dr Jacques Ramel, Université Lyon 2. Apologies were received from Albania, Cyprus, Latvia, Lithuania, Macedonia, Slovakia and Turkey. No apologies: Armenia, Germany and Russia.

The Board unanimously elected the current ESSE Secretary, Prof Smiljana Komar, and current ESSE Treasurer, Prof Alberto Lázaro, for a second term of office.

In 2017, the ESSE Board meeting will be held from 30-31 August in Thessaloniki, Greece.  
In 2018, the ESSE Board meeting will be held from 28-29 August in Brno, Czech Republic, in conjunction with the next ESSE Conference, which takes place from 29 Aug-2 Sept, 2018.  
In 2019, the ESSE Board meeting will be in Wroclaw, Poland.

**TREASURER'S REPORT**

The Treasurer's report for 2015, presented at the Board meeting, showed a positive balance of €10,988.06, which leaves ESSE accounts in a strong position. ESSE currently has a membership of 7,325 members from 32 countries, representing an increase of 166 members from the previous year. There was a gain in membership from some national associations (France, Germany, Ireland, Poland, Portugal and UK), and a drop in membership from others (Belgium, Finland, Greece, Italy and Switzerland). The Swedish membership numbers remain constant, with an increase in recent years. SWESSE members for 2015 were 208 (2014=210; 2013=195; 2012=171; 2011=161).

**ESSE WEBMASTER**

The ESSE webmaster, Dr Jacques Ramel, reported on the new ESSE website which was developed during the year. He was proud to announce that the site has been viewed 37,000 times by over 23,000 different visitors. Most viewed pages were the cfp. The *Messenger* homepage has dramatically increased its number of viewers since it has become an online journal. The link to the website is: <http://essenglish.org/>.

All SWESSE members – as automatic members of ESSE – receive *The European English Messenger*, published twice a year. The journal contains information, contacts and resources for scholarship and teaching, as well as interviews, conference reports and book reviews.

The editor of the *Messenger*, Dr Adrian Radu, gave his report at the Board meeting and said the journal will continue with themed issues. The next issue – 25-2, Winter 2016 – on the topic of “Shakespeare Lives”, is due out in December. For those who may be still interested in submitting an article, the extended deadline is 15 Nov, 2016.

### 3. RECENT SWESSE RELATED EVENTS

#### NAES (Nordic Association of English Studies) Conference

The 12th triennial conference for the Nordic Association of English Studies (NAES) was held at the University of Agder, Norway, 4-7 May, 2016. The conference was open to academics working in English linguistics, literatures in English, cultural studies, and English-language pedagogy. The theme was *Englishes and Changing Identities in the North*, and the focus was on discussions and re-evaluations of English identities, particularly in the Northern hemisphere, as realized through language, literature and culture. Prof Charles I. Armstrong was the host, and the conference was attended by a number of SWESSE members.

At the NAES General Meeting held during the conference, Charles Armstrong was elected President of NAES, replacing outgoing President Prof Anthony Johnson, Åbo Academy, Finland.

#### ESSE-13 Conference

As already referred to, the ESSE (European Society for the Study of English) Conference was held at the National University of Ireland, Galway, Mon 22 – Fri 26 Aug, 2016. The conference organisers were Prof Patrick Lonergan, Galway, and Dr Aoife Leahy, the Irish representative on the ESSE board.

The conference was very well attended, with over 800 delegates from many of the 32 ESSE member countries, as well as delegates from India, Japan, Russia and US. Plenary speakers included Paul Baker (Linguistics), Emma Smith (Cultural Studies), and the author Colm Tobin (Literature). The PhD sessions were particularly popular, with 4 literature sessions and 1 joint cultural and area studies/linguistics session. The total number of PhD students registered at the conference was 139. It was great to see a number of Swedish researchers in attendance presenting their work.

The next ESSE Conference, **ESSE-14**, will be held in Brno, the Czech Republic 2018. The conference will be organized by CZASE and the Department of English and American Studies of Masaryk University. The proposed dates are from 27 Aug–2 Sept, 2018. ### 4. SWESSE RELATED FORTHCOMING EVENTS

#### ESSE DOCTORAL SYMPOSIUM, 2017

The **ESSE Board** decided that as of 2017 an ESSE Doctoral Symposium will be organized every year. **The first ESSE Doctoral Symposium will take place in Thessaloniki, Greece on 28-29 August 2017.** (The second will form part of the ESSE Conference to be held in Brno, Czech Republic in 2018; the third will be organized in Wrocław, Poland in 2019; the fourth will form part of the ESSE Conference to be held in Lyon, France in 2020).

The purpose of the Symposium is to allow postgraduate students from all over Europe, who are writing their theses in English Studies, and are at least in the second year of their doctoral studies at the time of the Symposium in question, to meet and compare notes. The aim is to focus not so much on the details of the research as on the general approach taken to the subject and the methodology applied. SWESSE members, who are supervising doctoral students, are kindly encouraged to inform their students of this very useful forum for presenting their work and establishing valuable network contacts. ## **SWESSE AWARD FOR BEST BA THESES IN ENGLISH**

In order to encourage and reward research in English, SWESSE awards a biennial prize for outstanding BA theses in English, in literature and linguistics, respectively. Theses taking a didactic approach in either area are also considered. Each Swedish University or other Institution of Higher Education offering courses in English at BA-level may nominate one BA-level thesis in literature and one in linguistics as their Best English Thesis of the two preceding academic years. Nominations should be preceded by a collegial decision at each department, and the student whose thesis is submitted should be informed of this.

We welcome now nominations for theses defended in 2015 and 2016. Nominations must include electronic copies of the theses nominated (as Word-files), and should be sent to the Chair of each respective awards committee, by **Friday, February 10, 2017**. The juries in each category will meet in March and reach a decision.

The awards will be presented at the National Forum for English Studies meeting in Jönköping, April 26-28, 2017.
