Dear SWESSE Members

This is my first newsletter since taking up my role as SWESSE President, following the General Assembly election at the National Forum for English Studies 2013, Linnaeus University. Thanks again to the members of the SWESSE board for their vote of confidence in electing me as new President and a warm thanks to the outgoing President, Professor Karin Aijmer, Göteborg, for her contribution to the Association and her many years of faithful duty, and to the other outgoing SWESSE board members. The following members were also elected to the new Executive Committee: Professor Jean Hudson, Malmö University (Vice-President); Dr Anna Wärnsby, Malmö University (Treasurer); Dr Stuart Robertson, Uppsala University (Secretary); Dr Mats Deutschmann, Umeå University, (Webmaster); Dr Anna Swardh, Karlstad University; and Prof Magnus Ullén, Karlstad University.

One of the first aims of the new board was to draw up an updated list of members of the Association at the various Departments of English throughout Sweden, and to compile a mailing list for distribution of information and news relating to SWESSE. We are happy to say that many departments of English opt to pay a departmental membership for members of their staff and we thank our SWESSE board members Anna Swardh and Anna Wärnsby for helping to follow this up by contacting the various institutions in relation to payment of membership fees. The SWESSE fee is currently 250 SEK for a staff member and 125 SEK for a doctoral student. We also wish to raise the awareness of Association and its valuable contribution as a network in bringing together those engaged in teaching English language, literature, and civilization, at university level in Sweden, and in maintaining contacts with like-minded organizations in Europe and overseas. The distribution of this newsletter to all SWESSE members on the list is part of that endeavour.

SWESSE was founded in 2005 for the purpose of advancing research and teaching of the English language, literature and culture in Sweden. It serves as a forum co-operating with English departments in Sweden to organize conferences, symposia and workshops. REPORT FROM ESSE BOARD MEETING, 2013

One of my first duties as President of SWESSE was to attend the ESSE (The European Society for the Study of English) Board Meeting, in Cluj-Napoca, Romania, 29-30 August, 2013. The meeting is held annually and attended by board members representing 33 national associations of English Studies throughout Europe. The meeting in Cluj was attended by representatives from the following countries: Albania, Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Cyprus, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Serbia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, and United Kingdom. It was a great pleasure for me as a new member of the board to meet the different representatives and to engage in over two days of lively discussion and exchange of ideas. The aims of the Society in endeavouring to reflect the cultural and geographical diversity of Europe in its institutions is certainly lived up to in the interesting diversity of its representatives.

Among the many items on the agenda was the approval of the report from the ESSE-11 conference organisers, Istanbul 2012; the ESSE-12 conference organisers, Košice 2014; and the ESSE-13 conference organisers, Galway 2016. The Board approved a list of 15 subplenary lectures, 6 round tables, 73 seminars and 2 special events, proposed by the APC, for the forthcoming Košice 2014 ESSE conference. The full list of sub-plenary lectures, together with abstracts, is published on the ESSE website (www.esse2014kosice.sk).

The Sub-plenary lecture nominated by SWESSE, "(Child)Reign of Terror: Dangerous Child Régimes," by SWESSE member Dr Björn Sundmark, Malmö University, was among those approved by the Board, and the lecture will be presented in the Culture section at the Košice 2014 ESSE conference. We congratulate Björn Sundmark on this recognition, and SWESSE is pleased to sponsor his participation as an Honorary Presenter at the conference.

ESSE BOOK AWARDS 2014

The Board Meeting approved the appointment of the Book Awards Committees for 2014, and three members were appointed as adjudicators in each category. The awards are in the following categories:

• ESSE Book Award (Category A): A book prize of 1500 euro will be awarded by ESSE in 2014, for books first published in 2012 or 2013 in each of the following fields: a) English

language and linguistics; b) Literatures in the English language; c) Cultural studies in English.

• ESSE Book Award for Junior Scholars (Category B): A book prize of 500 euro will be awarded by ESSE in 2014 to a junior scholar for a first research book published in English in each of the three fields mentioned above, provided that publication was in 2012 or 2013. The deadline for submission of books is 1 February 2014. The winners will be announced at the ESSE-12 conference in Košice.

WORKSHOPS

Essay Writing Workshop, Högskolan Dalarna, Falun, Mon 16 Sept

Högskolan Dalarna hosted a well-attended essay writing workshop where participants from 11 different universities and högskolor met to discuss essay supervision practices and policies at their institutions. Professor Heidi Hansson, Umeå University, member of the HSV (UK-Ämbetet) Evaluation Committee, introduced a session focusing on essay grading criteria and learning outcomes, followed by a discussion. It was agreed to establish an essay-writing network where members would act as external evaluators for examined theses at each other's institutions. The participants expressed the wish to meet regularly, and we are delighted to confirm that the next essay-writing workshop will be held at Linnaeus University in Spring 2014. Workshop on University Didactics and English Literature, Halmstad Högskolan, October 4, 2013

Following on from some of the issues raised at the Dalarna meeting, Halmstad Högskolan had a day's workshop on didactics and creating a didactics network. Some of the questions discussed were: Post-HSV evaluation: how are we defining our discipline? What are its objectives? A 20-minute video presentation on didactic best practices, by Professor Maryellen Weimar, Penn State Professor Emeritus of Teaching and Learning, was used as a starting point, followed by a general discussion on Teaching theory.
