Autumn greetings to you all! This is a short update on SWESSE related activities and events that are of interest to all our members.

REPORT FROM ESSE BOARD MEETING, 2014

As representative for SWESSE, I was privileged to attend the ESSE (The European Society for the Study of English) Conference, in Košice, Slovakia, Fri 29 Aug – Tues 2 Sept 2014. The ESSE Board meeting, which took place the day before the conference on Thurs 28 Aug, was attended by the national representatives from 26 countries: Armenia, Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Lithuania, Malta, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, and United Kingdom. Also in attendance were the ESSE President, Prof Liliane Louvel, Université de Poitiers; Treasurer, Prof Alberto Lazaro, Universidad de Alcalá; Secretary, Prof Smiljana Komar, University of Ljubljana; Webmaster, Dr Jacques Ramel, Université Lyon 2; and Editor of *The Messenger*, Prof Hortensia Pârlog, West University of Timişoara, Romania. The meeting was as usual very rewarding, consisting of lively discussions and exchange of ideas, reflecting the cultural and geographical diversity of the representatives.

Among the many items on the agenda was the approval of the report from the organisers of the conference ESSE-12, Košice 2014, and the report from the organisers of the forthcoming conference ESSE 13, to be held in Galway 2016 – see further info below. Also presented at the conference were the winners of ESSE Book Awards, 2014.

ESSE SUB-PLENARY LECTURE

A much-appreciated sub-plenary lecture, "(Child)Reign of Terror: Dangerous Child Régimes," was presented by SWESSE-nominated member Björn Sundmark, Malmö University, in the Culture section at the Košice conference. The lecture focused on fictions where the social contract between the child and the adult has been irreparably broken, and where children have established their own regimes. Texts specifically analyzed were Stephen King's short story "Children of the Corn" (1977), and "The Enemy" (2009-), a series of zombie apocalypse-books by Charlie Higson.

On behalf of the SWESSE members I would like to congratulate Björn on his recent promotion to Professor of English at Malmö University.

RECENT SWESSE RELATED EVENTS

Essay Writing Workshop, Linnaeus University, Växjö, Mon 29 Sept 2014

Following the Essay Writing Workshop at Högskolan Dalarna, Sept 2013, and the establishment of an Essay Writing Network resulting from that meeting, Linnaeus University hosted a very well-attended essay-writing workshop on Mon 29 Sept 2014. The workshop organised by the dynamic Anna Greek, Lecturer in English Literature, and her team - was attended by over 30 participants from 14 universities and högskolor. The meeting began with a stimulating talk entitled "Reverse engineering an essay" by Diane Pecorari, Professor of English Linguistics at Linnaeus University. The talk addressed the topic of progression in preparing students to write a dissertation, focusing on sub-skills essential for success and how they can be developed strategically across the undergraduate curriculum. This was followed by a discussion on essay supervision practices and policies and in the afternoon by separate workshops for literature and linguistics.

NATIONAL FORUM FOR ENGLISH STUDIES

Luleå University of Technology, Wed 20 – Fri 22 May 2015

The forthcoming National Forum for English Studies will be held at Luleå University of Technology (LTU), Wed 20 – Fri 22 May 2015. We hope that as many SWESSE members as possible will be able to attend this gathering, which is being hosted by Lydia Kokkola, Prof of English and Education, at the Department of Arts, Communication and Education at Luleå.

The theme of the conference is "English and Education" with a particular focus on connections between current research in English and how English is taught at universities and schools throughout Sweden. Plenary sessions, poster sessions and working groups will discuss and reflect over current research projects and how these inform our work with undergraduates and society at large. Delegates are encouraged to present their on-going projects in the form of short papers and posters or to propose a workshop. There will also be time set aside for meetings of the main professional groups, and delegates are encouraged to propose subjects for discussion to those convening the meetings.

Confirmed keynote speakers include Roxanne Harde (University of Alberta), Jeannette Littlemore (University of Birmingham), Eva Björck (The Swedish Research Council) and Norbert Schmitt (University of Nottingham).

CALL FOR SEMINARS, ROUND TABLES AND PARALLEL LECTURES

ESSE/SWESSE members are invited to submit proposals for seminars and round tables on topics related to our fields of study: English Language, Literatures in English, and Cultural Studies (broadly defined). Proposals for seminars and round tables should be submitted directly to the Academic Programme Committee (APC) at esseabstracts2016@gmail.com.

National Associations are invited to nominate potential lecturers. Suggestions for lecturers should be sent to the Presidents or representatives of the National Associations, who will send the nominations to the APC. (We look forward to receiving your expressions of interest for nomination in due course). There will be approximately 12 parallel lectures given by ESSE members nominated by their National Associations. These parallel lectures are expected to have a wide appeal and to reflect recent developments in scholarship in one of the three areas mentioned above. They will be fifty minutes in length. National Associations should forward a description of their nominee's proposed topic together with a brief summary of his or her CV. Each national association can propose up to three lecturers, each of them in one of the three main fields mentioned above, so that the APC can have a wide range of options for the final selection. Please note that ESSE will not finance the parallel lecturers' costs of attending the conference, but that their conference fees will be waived.
